The party was given by Mr. and Mrs. David Cogan, brother and sister-in-law of Mr. Cohen, and both put in a great deal of time and effort to make the affair the complete success that it was. They were assisted by Mrs. Sadie Gediman, Miss Mary Arik, Miss Evelyn Petlock, and Miss Esther Petlock. Forty-nine were present.

The party was indeed a complete surprise to Mr. and Mrs. Cohen, who, although they had been told that they and all the members of the congregation were at once needed to consult a man relative to installing a heater in the synagogue, were reluctant to come. In Zvezmer, they will visit Mrs. Cohen's grandmother, Slove Petlock, and her aunts and uncles, whom she also has not seen since her arrival in America. Nathan Petlock, Mrs. Cohen's father, is the only child of Mrs. Slove Petlock to reside in America.

The Cohens expect to return Sept. 6 on the Laconia, by way of Hamburg.
