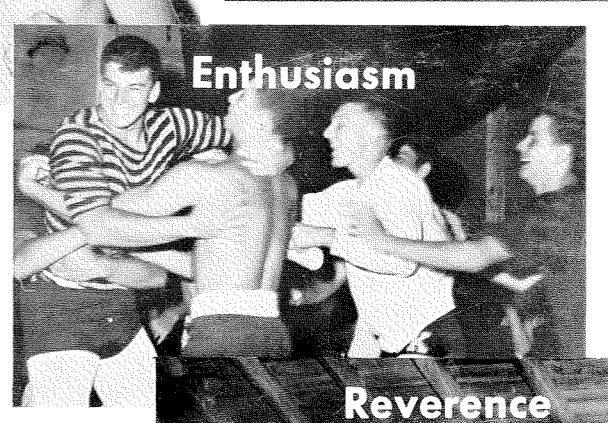
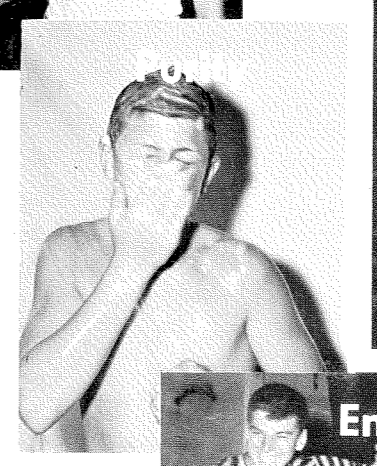
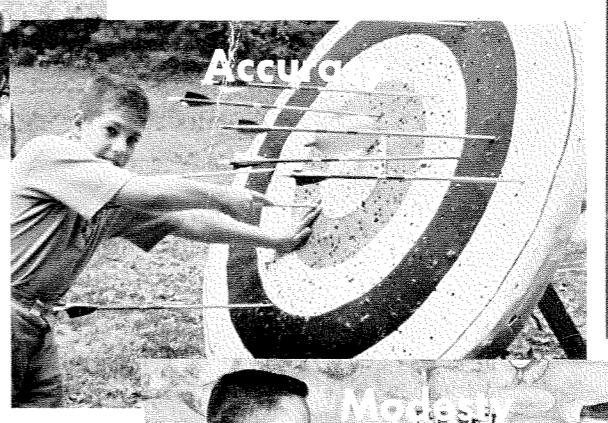
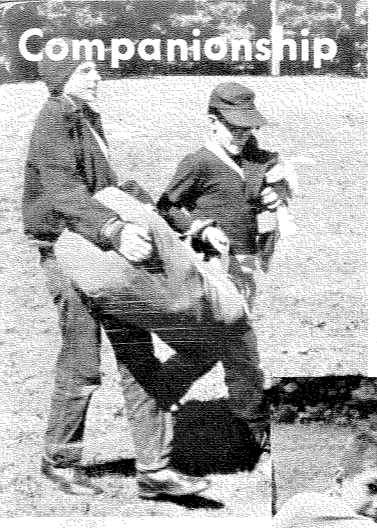
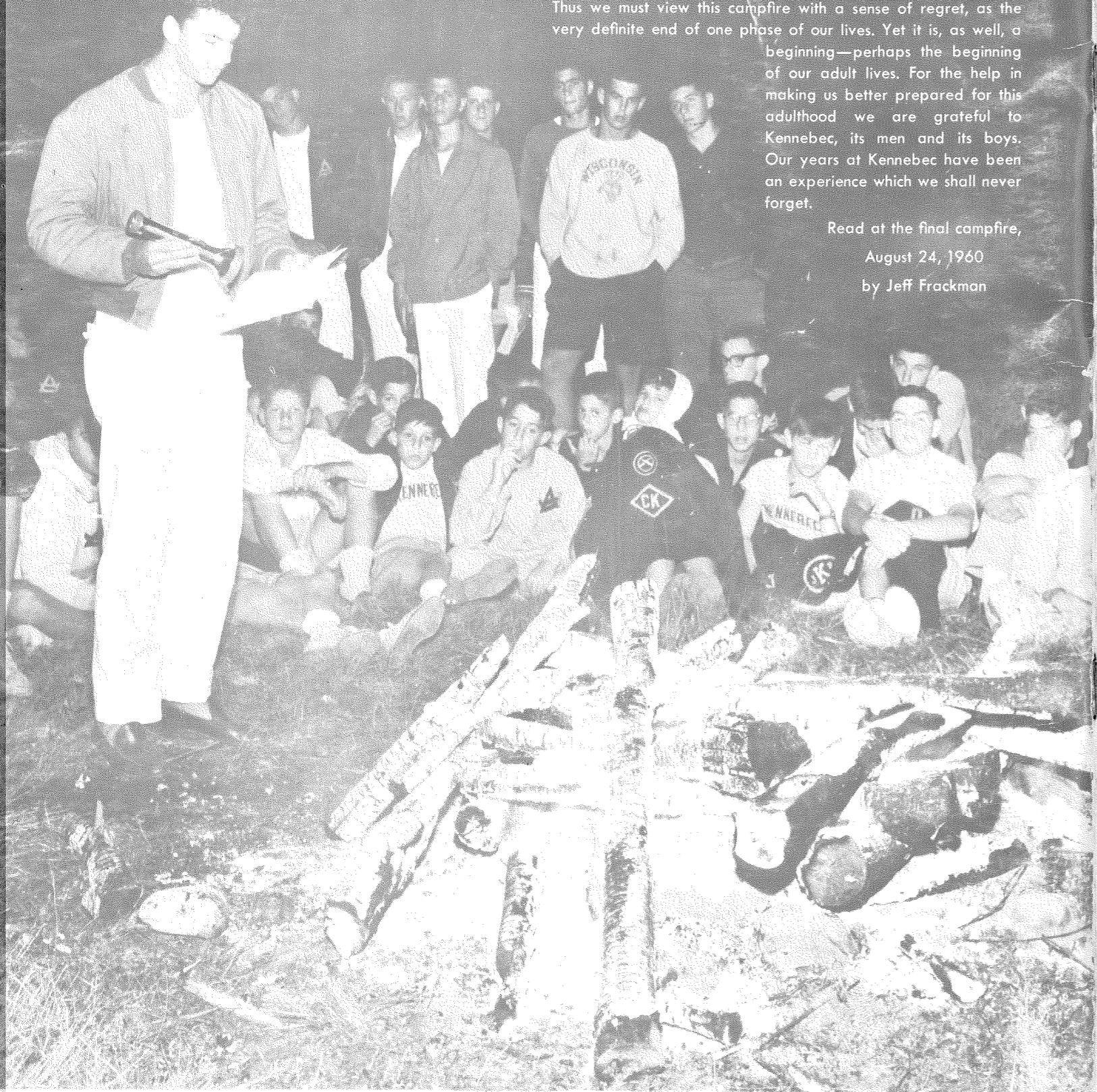


VALEDICTORY

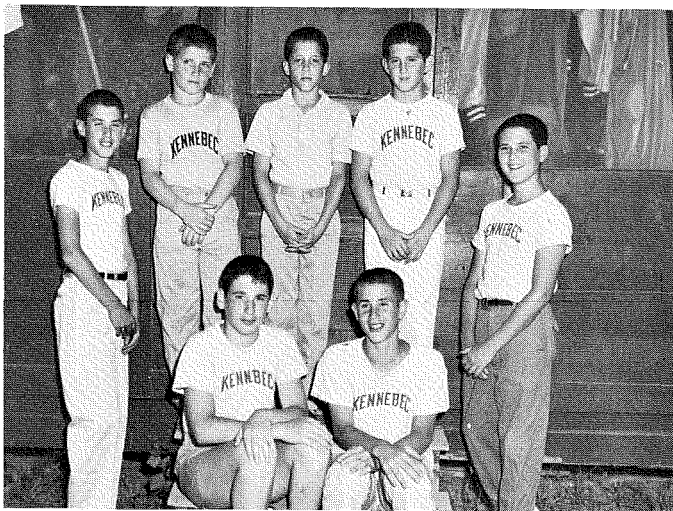
Pioneers

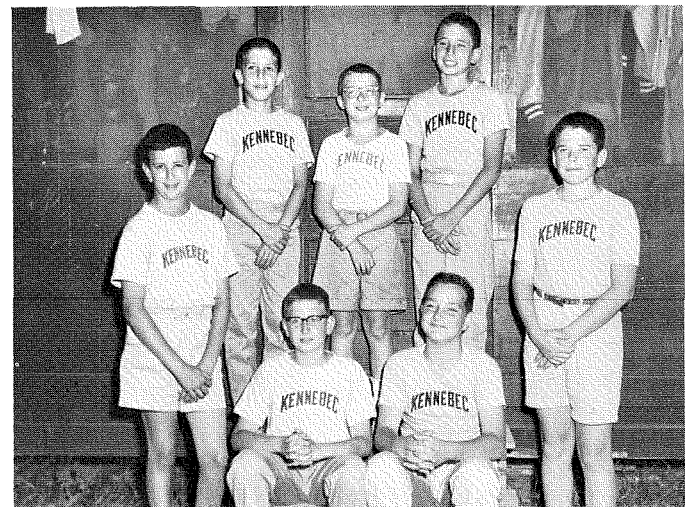

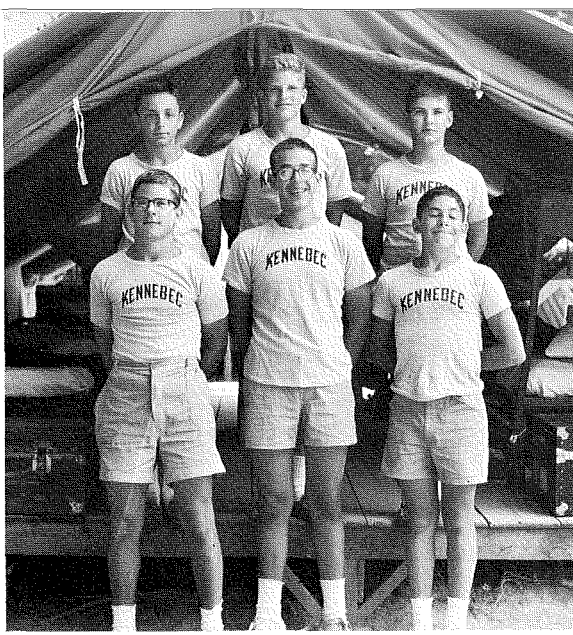
As one grows older and moves from one group to another, he realizes more and more the opportunities at Kennebec and the future year in the First Section.



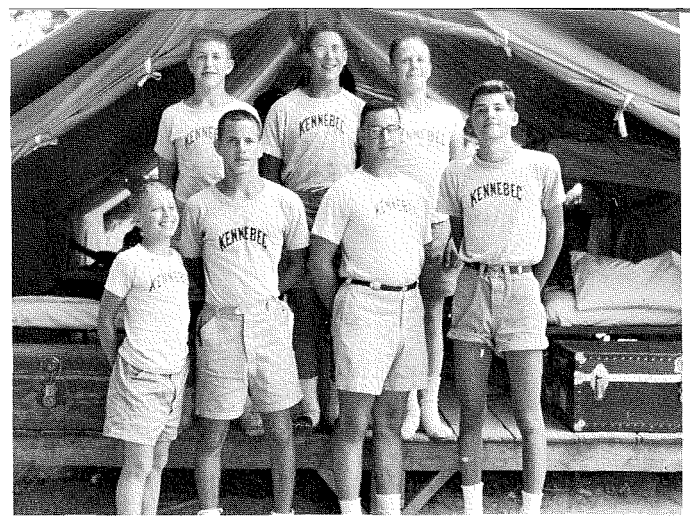

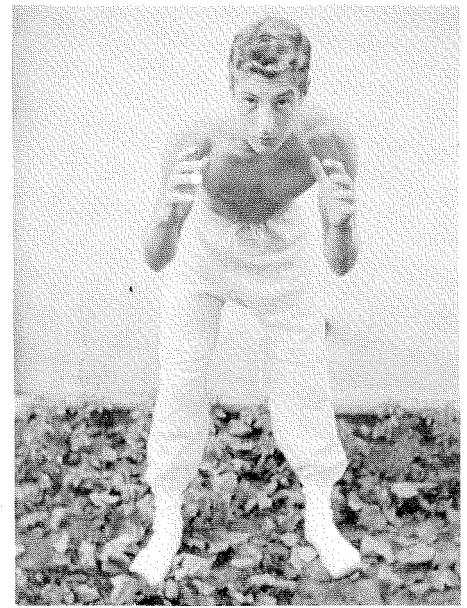


1960 FIRST SECTION

ELEVENTH DAY—Return to Kennebec.



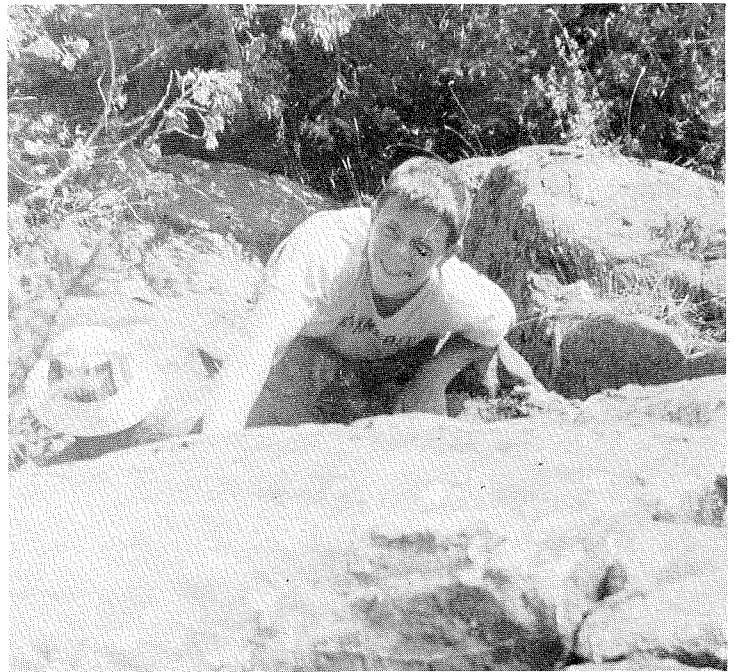
