



Rabbi's Message

The entire membership of Beth Israel Congregation is to be congratulated upon this joyous occasion of the dedication of our new synagogue. Long have we awaited this day and the feelings of great accomplishment and satisfaction overwhelm us all.



History of the Beth Israel Congregation

Shortly after the turn of the century, in the days of the horse and wagon and the itinerant peddler, seven men of the Jewish faith settled in Waterville. These men, who earned their livelihood by peddling various wares, soon were faced with the need to band together in an effort to foster Judaism for themselves and their families. The Beth Israel Congregation was chartered June 16, 1902.

These seven founding fathers included Julius Levine, William Levine, Louis Wolman, John Paikowsky, Phillip Levine, Moses Silver and John Williams.

Their ultimate goal was to build a House of Worship for the Jewish residents of Waterville. Before this dream could become reality, however, they found it necessary to conduct religious services at various private homes in the community. High Holy Day Services were conducted at Hose No. 4 Fire Station on Ticonic Street.

On August 21, 1903, a barn, situated on the corner of Kelsey and Ticonic Streets, was purchased by the Congregation. This barn was dismantled, and by securing additional new lumber, work was begun on the new building. The project was accomplished under the direction and guidance of Mr. Charles Fitzgerald of Winslow.

In 1905, the Beth Israel Synagogue on Kelsey Street was completed. This was unique in that it was wholly supported from dues of members, which at that time, were ten cents a week, or \$5.00 per year.

There was a substantial mortgage however, and twenty years later, in 1925, the balance of the mortgage was paid by William Levine, in memory of his son Theodore N. Levine.

Mr. Moses Silver, who emigrated to Waterville in 1900, became the first "Shochet" or ritual slaughterer, even before the completion of the Synagogue. Mr. Hyman L. Shenson became the spiritual leader in the years that followed until about 1914, at which time there was a succession of different rabbis. In 1921, Reverend Abraham M. Hains arrived in Waterville, and remained as spiritual leader, until his death in 1953. Rabbi David P. Prince succeeded Rev. Hains in 1954, and left Waterville to accept a pulpit in Ambridge, Pennsylvania.

Out of the growth of the Jewish population in Waterville after World war II, there again rose a need, both physical and aesthetic, for a larger and more modern place of worship.

In June, 1957, building was begun on the present structure. This was done as a result of the dynamic leadership of Mr. David Gray, president of the Congregation, the Board of Directors, and their capable committees. Through the generosity of Mr. and Mrs. Harold Alfond, the present edifice stands at the corner of Main and Kelsey Streets. This was completed in March of 1958.

Rabbi Nathaniel Steinberg now leads Beth Israel Congregation. He serves well in all duties and functions that his title connotes. May we, in Waterville, continue to prosper under the able leadership of Rabbi Steinberg, and look forward to many more years of tutelage and inspiration from him.



REVEREND ABRAHAM M. HAINS

For 32 years, Reverend Hains was the spiritual leader of the Jewish community in Waterville. He officiated as rabbi, teacher, and cantor. He was renowned and respected throughout the state of Maine for his devotion to all worthy causes. He served as President of the Zionist Organization, and was active in the Jewish National Fund and the United Jewish Appeal.

Reverend Hains is remembered, above all, for his humility, understanding, and devoted loyalty to the community. In tribute to his memory, the social hall of Beth Israel Synagogue building is to be known as the Abraham M. Hains Community Center.



I know that I express the thoughts of each one of them when I say that we will do our utmost to share in the work and responsibility of keeping our Synagogue an inspiration for ourselves and our children.

The officers working with me for the past two years have given their earnest support: First Vice-President, Mrs. Ralph Nash; Second Vice-President, Mrs. Theodore Rosenthal; Recording Secretary, Mrs. Hyman Paikowsky; Corresponding Secretary, Mrs. Burton Shiro; Financial Secretary, Mrs. Gordon Wolman; and Treasurer, Mrs. David Gray. We hope to bring warmth, beauty, and high moral standards of Judaism into our homes, so that our children will learn a way of life that will make for a better world.

History of Beth Israel Religious School

A group of 14 determined women in the early 1920's set out to provide a Hebrew School in order that their children might receive the Hebrew education which they had been lacking.

They formed a group known as the Daughters of Miriam, spearheaded by Mrs. Leah Silver, and also included Mesdames Leah Rosenthal, Rachel Levine, Annie Cook, Sara Levine, Mary Wein, Freda Libby Levine, Anna Snyder, Zelda Rosenthal, Annie Williams, Jennie Paikowsky, Dora Levine, Gelle Wolman, Chanah Baron.

These 14 women, by their perseverance, conducted traveling whist parties, and other fund-raising functions, in order to achieve their goal. With the proceeds derived from these functions, they were able to purchase in 1924 the Talmud Torah, or Hebrew School, at 38 Ticonic Street.

Consequently, Jewish children of that time, were able to attend continuous Hebrew classes, under the instruction of various rabbis and teachers.

The mortgage of this building was subsequently paid by the late Harold Sterns of Waterville and Boston, in about 1949.

In the years to follow, a Sunday session was added to the curriculum, under the supervision of Gertrude Williams Levine, and classes were taught by parents of the pupils, and a few interested Colby students.

With the destruction of the Talmud Torah by fire on December 26, 1948, Sunday classes were transferred to the YMCA on Temple St., under the direction of Mrs. Burton G. Shiro. The classes were again moved to Coburn Classical Institute, and ultimately to the present Beth Israel Synagogue.

The daughters of Miriam eventually affiliated with the Women's Grand Lodge of B'nai B'rith, and was then called the Theodore N. Levine Chapter of B'nai B'rith. This latter group, in addition to being a Jewish service and philanthropic organization, assumed the financial responsibility connected with the Sunday School, and was relieved of this last duty, with the organization of the Beth Israel Sisterhood in 1954.






