

GOOD CONCERT BY THE TEXAS BAND FOR JEWISH RELIEF

Hundreds of people applauded the Texas marine band which rendered a fine concert at the patriotic rally in aid of the Jewish war relief Thursday night. It was the first public appearance of the entire band and the musicians received most favorable criticism from the large audience.

The band first paraded through the streets preceded by an automobile in which were Alderman Nelson L. Jackson, representing Mayor J. Edward Drake, Harry Cohen, chairman of the local relief committee, Private William E. LaFay of the 14th railroad engineers now invalided home and First class yeoman Schroeder, U. S. N.

After a few selections by the band, Chairman Cohen introduced Private LaFay, who told his audience something of the terrors of war and made a glowing appeal for the Jewish war relief. America was sung by the vast audience and led by Private LaFay the crowd repeated the allegiance to the flag.
