

# ALDERMAN POVICH STRONG SUPPORTER FOR WARD ONE FOLK

## Speaks in Behalf of Needed Highway Improvements at the South End

That Alderman Samuel Povich, who only took his seat in the upper branch of the city council a few weeks ago, intends to look after the interests of his constituents was proved at the monthly meeting Wednesday of last week when he introduced a couple of petitions and spoke in behalf of certain highway improvements he feels are needed in his ward. A petition for an electric light at Pine and Highland streets received several words of endorsement from Alderman Povich who described the peculiar lighting conditions that exist in that locality, while he endorsed a petition of Earl B. Lermond, for the abatement of a depression in front of his home at 45 Weeks street that causes a puddle after rain storms. The former was referred to the committee on lighting and the latter to the board of highways and sewers.

City Clerk Gilmore reported that he had collected thus far \$633 in licenses, \$376 in dog fees and \$257 in city license fees. The transfer of a sum not to exceed \$250 for the committee on manufactures and manufacturing was ordered. Roll of accounts No. 5 amounting to \$2,353.28 was ordered and City Treas. Hall's monthly report was submitted as follows:
