

# **INTER-FAITH MEETING NEXT SUNDAY NIGHT**

## **Mass Meeting to Show Solidarity of Religious Forces to Be Held at Morse Auditorium**

Rev. Timothy C. Maney, St. Mary's Roman Catholic church, will lead the assembly in prayer and Rabbi Abraham May, Beth Israel Synagogue, will pronounce the benediction Sunday evening when Rev. Ewart Edmund Turner, Lowell, Mass., will be speaker at the inter-faith meeting to be held in Morse high school auditorium. As befitting an occasion of this kind, Mayor Donald N. Small, representing the City of Bath, will be chairman of the meeting. Jack Shaw, director of Central Congregational choir, will be in charge of music and Mrs. Shaw will be pianist for the evening. Special selections will be furnished by the combined Central church choir and Winter Street quartet.

This mass meeting, which begins at eight o'clock, is to serve as a demonstration of the solidarity of the religious forces as they face the struggle against secularism, which is shaking the Twentieth Century. In this struggle Catholics, Protestants and Jews find themselves assailed by the same foes and fighting the same battles. The heroism of those in Europe who have stood their ground in this relentless warfare has given new dignity to organized religion.

Participating in this meeting will be clergymen of the three main religious faiths represented in Bath. It is hoped that every denomination will have a representative on the platform. Ushers will be chosen from the various churches of the city.
