

FUNERAL SERVICES FOR MRS. ROSA POVICH

Bath Woman Who Dies in Washington Had Been Resi- dent Here 25 Years

Funeral services were held from the Jewish Synagogue in Portland Friday afternoon for Mrs. Rosa Povich, widow of Nathan Povich of this city, and burial was in Mt. Sinai cemetery.

Mrs. Povich, whose home was at 327 Front street, was passing the Winter in Washington, D. C., with her children. She had been as well as usual but suffered an ill turn from which she failed to recover.

Mrs. Povich was born in Lithuania 73 years ago. She came to Bath as a bride of 18 with her husband, who was a merchant with business locations in Bath and Bar Harbor. Of the 55 years passed in Maine, 30 years were at Bar Harbor and 25 in Bath. Mrs. Povich possessed a lovable nature and had a large circle of friends who will miss her cheery company. She was a woman with a splendid education and keen mind.

She was a member of the Hebrew Ladies' Society of Bath, a life member of the Hias Auxiliary and a member of Queen Esther Rebekah lodge of this city, and of the Temple Chapter, Order of the Eastern Star, Washington, D. C.

Mrs. Povich is survived by four daughters, Mrs. Morris Povich of this city, Miss Goldie Povich and Miss Celia Povich of Boston and Mrs. Benjamin Mensh of Washington, D. C.; four sons, Shirley Povich, sports writer of the Washington Post, Abraham Povich of Washington, D. C., Bernard Povich, U. S. A., serving in New Guinea, and Jay Povich who made his home with his mother, and eight grandchildren.
