HARRY LAIT

Former Patrolman At Bath Iron Works Dies

Harry Lait, 52, of 44 Bluff road died early Sunday morning in the Thayer hospital, Waterville. He was on a week end trip to Bangor to visit a brother when taken ill in that city Saturday. Funeral was Monday afternoon at two from the home of his brother, Lawrence Lait, 67 Poplar street, Bangor. Burial was in a Bangor cemetery.

Born in Old Town Nov. 21, 1900, Mr. Lait was a son of Hyman and Rachel Lait. He was graduated from Old Town High school and the University of Maine.

Mr. Lait had resided in Bath for approximately 12 years and from 1946 to 1948 was employed as a security patrolman at the Bath Iron Works. Since 1949 he had been employed for the government in the forestry department at Fort Williams, Portland.

He was a member of the Beth Israel synagogue, the American Legion Post of Bath, the Old Town Lodge of Elks and the Forty and Eight of Old Town.

Surviving are his wife, Jennie of Bath; two daughters, Miss Roberta R. Lait and Mrs. Irene Freedman, both of Boston; two brothers, Saul of Old Town and Lawrence of Bangor.

The Tedd-Lait Post of the American Legion, Old Town, was named for his brother Henry who was killed in action in World War I. ✓
