Notes for Jack I. Novick:

Though he is shown as Jack I. Novick in the Maine on-line marriage database, he appears in the 1930 census as Jack E. Novick. Jack's parents were Samuel and Annie Novick. According to Jack's son Sam, Jack's father Sam settled in Portland in 1906, married Annie Serlick in 1912, and opened Hub Furniture in 1913.

The family doesn't appear in the 1910 census index. Some pages of the census are faint, so it may be that appropriate pages were too faint to read.

The 1920 census shows Samuel and Annie Novich ("Novich" is listed in the census index, but the writing could be "Novick."), ages 31 and 30, living at 38 Cedar Street in Portland. They have two children, Mary and David. Mary is 7 years old and David is 4 years, 2 months. Samuel is listed with the occupation of "manager" and business "furniture store." According to this census, Samuel and Annie were both born in "Minsk Russia," and immigrated in 1905 and 1908 (?) respectively. Samuel is listed as having been naturalized in 1919. Their native language is shown as Russian. The children are listed as born in Maine. They rent half of a two family house, and Samuel Serlick, who owns the house, heads the other family.

Samuel Serlick was probably related to Annie. He is shown as 55 years old, and his wife Bessie is 52. They have children Annie 17, Max 24, and Sadie, 11. Everyone except Sadie is shown as having been born in Minsk. Sadie is shown as born in Maine, indicating that the family was in Maine during the prior 1910 census. Samuel is a peddler in the rag business; Annie is a clerk in a bakery; and Max is machinist in a machine shop.

The 1930 census shows the Novick family at 49 Williams St. in Portland, and Samuel is listed with the occupation "proprietor" in the business "furniture store." Family members and ages are Samuel 41, Annie D. 40, Mary 17, David 14, and Jack E. 3 years, 7 months. Mary and David are shown to have attended school within the last year. Samuel and Annie are shown as having been born in Russia, the children in Maine. Samuel's immigration date is shown as 1908 and Annie's as 1907. Their native language is shown as "Jewish." Samuel and Annie had been married for 18 years, putting their marriage date at 1911-1912. They own their home, which is valued at \$10,000 and they own a radio set. Samuel is listed as not being a military veteran. The family has a servant named Celia Heffritz, age 30, who had emigrated from Russia in 1922.

No census records were found in 1910 for either Samuel Novick or Samuel Serlick.
