NEW YEAR PERSPECTIVE

With the New Year almost upon us, the Almighty through our Tradition asks us to do the seemingly impossible - look at the past and future simultaneously in order to fashion a better present. Throughout the month of Elul that precedes the New Year we blow the Shofar and pray that Jews nurture their humanity. In the Torah the Shofar signaled Israel's movement. Today, the Shofar is intended to move Jews toward healthy, principled living which is sensitive to others. When viewing past and future vividly, we learn from the Almighty that a good life in present reality is only possible with the capacity for forgiveness and compassion to overcome hatred and dispute.

How can we possibly accomplish this? The Mishnah asks Jews to become humbled with the knowledge that all people have a common origin (dust) and a common end (death). Human beings are all somehow imperfect. The individual who is humbled by the broad perspective cultivates mature hope. The individual who is unmoved by its challenges create walls to compassion.

As Rosh Hashanah approaches, we should each try a bit harder to:

• take offense less often and more slowly;

· speak privately and constructively to those who disap-

It is an odd year for interpreting hidden meanings. Because Hebrew uses letters to represent numbers, it is often possible to draw a hidden meaning from the word spelled out by the New Year. The year 5757 spells Tishnoz, which doesn't mean anything in Hebrew. Of course, Shnoz is slang for a nose in Yiddish, and Tishnoz could be read, with a great deal of poetic license, as: You will "nose" it.

To stick one's nose into something implies getting involved. Our community is in need of people who are willing to put their "nose" to it, who are unafraid to get involved and make a difference. The past year has afforded us the opportunity to examine the organizational relationships within the Bangor-area Jewish community. The coming year ought to be a time when we engage in the best, most cooperative community planning that we can muster.

We need to put our noses into it, not turn away from the task of building a stronger Jewish community. We should take care not to let our noses get out of joint if the process is not easy, nor should we be nosey about the progress of others. We should aim for the virtue of putting our noses to the grindstone.

Let's make this the year of the Shnoz, the year we did the hard work of rebuilding and renewing, based on mutual respect, and *ahavat Yisrael*, love of the Jewish people.


