SATURDAY NIGHT SUNDAES- LIVE...FROM BANGOR, ME..IT'S SATURDAY NIGHT SUNDAES! October 20th was the date, Beth Abraham was the site of the first Malevah Malkah of 5762, and what a gala event it was. It began with Make Your Own Sundaes, where you had your choice of 7 types of ice cream and 14 types of toppings. But there was more. Later that night there was a raffle and auction for a two-day stay in Bretton Woods, N.H. The raffle was based upon questions concerning the weekly Torah portion. Everyone had their Chumash open and learned like never before. The atmosphere was electrically charged and people enjoyed learning the Torah. At the end of the night, there were two big winners. Mazel tov to the Cantor and Rolnick families. Hope to see you next time...just think, you could be the next winner!!!!!

STUDENTS LIKE HEBREW SCHOOL! - A parent stormed into my office and said "What did you do to my children?! They WANT to come to Hebrew school and they rush to do their homework. They treat it like their Public School work." Then the parent smiled and said, "I don't know how you did it, but thank you...it's great, whatever you're doing." The school operates Monday through Thursday from 3:45 P.M. - 5:00 P.M. We meet everyday thus reinforcing what we learned the day before and fostering the understanding that Jewish education is at least as important as secular education. We have a fast paced and exciting program; proven by the fact that the students are even riding their bikes to school, so that they will be on time!

**ADULT EDUCATION**—You've asked for it, and it's here. Our Adult education program is in full swing. You still have time to join up now and be among the premier group of Torah scholars in our community. We have courses for everyone in the community and the classes are taught in a user-friendly manner. If you ever wanted to approach Torah in an exciting manner this is your chance; the courses are as follows:

- Sunday: 8:30 A.M. --Talmud Megillah --This course examines the text of the megillah and the laws associated with it. Many
  other topics are broached as we navigate our way through the Talmudic sea. Some topics include the number of Aliyot on particular days, who is entitled to aliyot, the special mitzvot of Purim, etc.
- Monday: 7:00 P.M. -- Chumash B'raishit -- The creation story is examined in detail. What was Hashem's intention when He created the world? Why does the Torah use anthropomorphism? If light was created on the first day, then what is the creation of the sun, moon, and stars doing on the fourth day? Which of the rabbis are closest to the simple understanding of the story as it is told?
- Tuesday: 7:00 P.M. -- Book of Joshua -- Joshua was the first leader after Moshe, what were his struggles? What was the political climate of the day? How did the Jewish people feel about Joshua? How successful were his campaigns?
- Wednesday: 7:00 P.M. -- Megillat Esther -- If you think you fully understand this story, think again. It is one of the most phenomenal stories in the Tanach and the least understood. Was Achashevarosh a simple drunk or a covert anti-Semite? Why isn't Hashem's name mentioned in this book? Who was Cyrus' mother and who was Vashti's father? If you can't answer these questions, then this may be the course for you!
- Sunday Thursday: Between mincha and maariv --Daily halachot -- we are presently learning the laws concerning our routine in the mornings. Our compressed sessions lend to an interesting and informative break between mincha and maariv.
- Shabbat: 45 minutes before mincha -- Maimonides: Laws of Repentance -- This treatise covers the philosophy of repentance as
  well as presenting practical methods of how to do it. It will also touch on messianic times and what we should expect.

The classes, with the exceptions of daily halacha and Maimonides, are normally one hour long. All classes are held in English and no previous knowledge is necessary. Books may be purchased from the bookstore. Books will be helpful, as they will allow you to review the material at home, as well as to prepare for class. If you would like to have other classes, please contact me in the shul office (207) 947-0876. I look forward to seeing everyone at class. —Rabbi Fred Nebel


