Words of Torah from Rabbi Saks

The saga of Joseph and his brothers continues in Parashat Vayigash. Up until this point, Joseph's life has been a rollercoaster. He begins by being loved by his father and hated by his brothers. Then, we find him the perfect servant of Potiphar, but the object of Potiphar's wife's unwanted advances. Joseph is cast in prison, but pulled out to be Pharaoh's dream interpreter and eventually his right-hand man. When the famine that Joseph has predicted strikes the region, his brothers appear before him and he catches them in a scheme, framing his only full brother, Benjamin. The rabbis wonder about Joseph's intention in this moment. Is he simply out for revenge? Some commentators certainly think so. But Rabbi Samson Raphael Hirsch insists that Joseph's motive when he frames Benjamin are not revenge, but instead to change his opinion of his brothers and their opinion of him. He needs a climactic moment, one that tests their trust in each other, in order for their relationship to move forward. If Rabbi Hirsch is right, then we can be inspired by Joseph and find a way to rise above our desire for revenge when it hits us and instead seek reconciliation and growth in fraught relationships.

Religious School

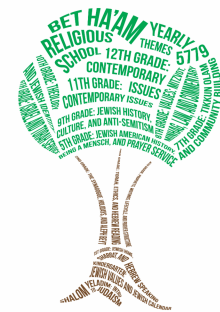
Religious School on Zoom
