Bat Mitzvah

Sophia Gavin–January 23, 2021

Sophia is a 7th grade student at Breakwater school in Portland. She is the only child of Andrea Krasker and Chip Gavin. Sophia dances with Portland Ballet and has performed in the Victorian Nutcracker for six years. She plays piano and enjoys swimming. She also loves to read and travel and has a pet bunny named Mochi. Sophia is thankful for her close group of friends at Bet Ha'am, some of whom she has known since Shalom Yeladim.

For Sophia's Bat Mitzvah Project, she chose to spread awareness about period poverty and atigma and to raise funds for period products to be distributed



through the Michael Klahr Jewish Family Services (KJFS) food pantry. Girls and women all around the world menstruate, and one in four of them don't have access to the products that they need. Not having the right products leads to health issues, stigma, and missing work and school. Sophia hopes that period products become more available for all women and that as people talk more about menstruation, they realize that it is normal and natural and should not have stigma around it.

Sophia would like to thank everyone who helped her on her journey to becoming a Bat Mitzvah – her tutor Ellie Miller, Rabbi Saks, Sam Spinrad, all of her past and current Bet Ha'am teachers, and her friends and family for all their support.
