# Words of Torah from Rabbi Saks

With this week's double portion of *Vayak'heil-P'kudei*, we conclude the book of Exodus. The final two portions, paired together this year, detail for the ancient Israelites and for us the instructions for the construction of the *Mishkan*, the sanctuary in that would travel with the Israelites in the wilderness, providing them with a place to worship God that would become the basis for the Temple in Jerusalem. Through these two portions six chapters, there is a great deal of repetition in the text, which to our modern ears can begin to



sound monotonous. How many times must we read that the yarn was blue, purple, and crimson or that the people's hearts were moved to provide the supplies for the *Mishkan*? In our *chumash*, our Torah commentary, Rabbi W. Gunther Plaut teaches that for the ancient audience, repetition was not only necessary, but a welcomed literary device. Remember, the people of the ancient Near East were likely illiterate, so they would not have pored over a repetitive text, but rather become more engaged with the story by hearing its details again and again. Think of the child who wants the same book read night after night, who is enthralled with its story and begins to internalize its message. This was the purpose of the Torah's repetition of the instructions for the *Mishkan*, that the ancient audience would internalize its message and take it to heart. Today, our task is to find what speaks to us from the Torah scroll and to pore over it again and again so that its ordinary details become extraordinary and holy for us.

### March 14, 1:00 PM

#### **Stories of Hope Featuring Combatants for Peace Activists**

On the 2018 congregational trip to Israel, Rabbi Saks and members of our congregation had the opportunity to meet with members of Kehilat Shir Chadash in Tzur Hadassah



and residents of Husan, a Palestinian community just across the Green Line from Tzur Hadassah. Our dialogue included Ziyad Sabbatean, a Palestinian leader and founder of Combatants for Peace, a grassroots organization formed by former Israeli soldiers and former Palestinian prisoners who have come together to speak their truths, listen to one another, and work towards peace. *Disturbing the Peace* is a powerful documentary about this group of people who are on the front lines of peace work among Israelis and Palestinians today. Congregation Beth El in Bangor has invited the Maine Jewish community to participate in a conversation with two Combatants for Peace activists on Sunday, March 14, 1:00-2:30 PM. The activists will share their personal stories of transformation and the work they are doing to bring peace, equality, and freedom.
