Words of Torah from Rabbi Saks

The closing verses of this week's Torah portion, *Vayikra*, which is the first portion in the book of Leviticus, teach us that when we trespass against God by harming another person, we are commanded not only to seek God's forgiveness, but also make restitution to the person whom we've harmed. We know this from our Yom Kippur liturgy, which teaches us that God can forgive us for the mistakes we make in our relationship with God, but not for the mistakes we make with others until we have acquired their



forgiveness. The layer of this commandment, though, that we might overlook is that primarily, Judaism views these transgressions in the context of our relationship with God. The text says, "When a person sins and commits a trespass against the Eternal by dealing deceitfully with one's fellow..." First and foremost, our encounters with others are encounters with the Divine. While we may grow concerned about how our negative interactions with others will negatively impact our relationship with God, we can take great comfort in knowing that when we benefit others, we benefit our relationship with God, sometimes far beyond what is within our comprehension.
