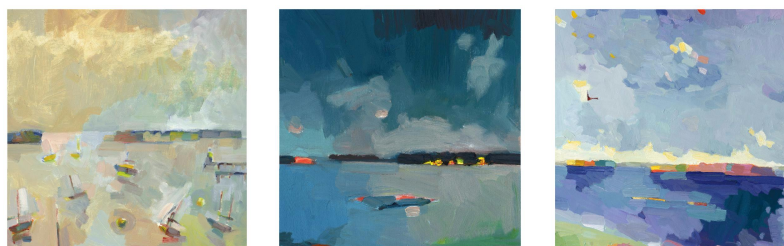

His style-broken brushwork and a palette of delicate blues, greens, pinks, and yellows-marks him as one of the most recognizable artists painting in Maine today. He is both worldly and down to earth, both witty and self-effacing, generous with his time, and passionate about the dangers of the art world's becoming overly commercialized."
