## Jacob Cousins Memorial





Unveiled in September 1935, the Jacob
Cousins Memorial was part of an ongoing
nationwide effort to highlight both the
patriotism of Jewish Americans and their
contribution during times of conflict. The
memorial is a key artifact in the history of
the Jewish community in southern Maine
linking past to present and inspiring
visitors to remember, respect and
contemplate the cost of war.

The memorial was significantly renovated with extensive bench seating for viewing it and Casco Bay. The restoration was officially opened on October 1, 2018. Shaarey Tphiloh is proud to be one of the community sponsors of this memorial. Friends of the Eastern Promenade is continuing to raise funds to cover the cost of the recent redesign of this historic landmark.
