

ETHICAL DIMENSIONS OF THE ISRAEL / PALESTINE CONFLICT

As the recent war in and around Gaza once again demonstrated, the conflict over the Land of Israel/Palestine raises profound ethical questions which reasonable people of good will answer differently. This text-based, discussion-oriented course for teens and

adults explores ethical dilemmas associated with Israeli responses to Hamas attacks, resistance to what Palestinians regard as Israeli occupation, the use of history to justify Israeli and Palestinian claims, and the nature of Israel as a self-defined Jewish state. Come explore these dilemmas, reflect on your own responses to them, and gain a deeper understanding of why some people respond differently.
