Jewish Ethical Wills for the 21st Century with Jay Sherwin

Sunday, July 26, 9:30-11 a.m.

Ethical wills (*tzava'ot* in Hebrew) offer a wonderful opportunity for people to reflect on their values and life lessons and to offer guidance and blessings to their families and loved ones. In this one-session online workshop with Life Review Adviser Jay Sherwin of Portland, we'll briefly review the rich Jewish history of legacy writing, a tradition that begins with Jacob in Genesis 49. Then, through discussion and brief writing exercises, the workshop will offer advice and a model structure to help you begin crafting your own ethical will or legacy letter.


