By- Laws- of Congregation
Beth Israel
adopted Oct. 14th-1914

- 1st All members who have signed application are members
- 2nd New Members may be incorporated by majority vote of actual membership upon payment of Entrance membership of Ten dollars (\$10)
- 3rd Actual members including all members taken in shall pay annually the sum of six dollars (\$6.00) and for failure of paying according to this section members or member can be excluded from participating in said corporation
- 4th The Annual Meeting of said corporation shall be the day following the Hebrew New Year

- 5- The President, by giving actual notice to Trustees, may call a meeting for (Special) business and social purposes - but by mail
6. By-laws shall not be changed or any more made except at Annual meeting and by majority vote
- 7 For purposes of conveyance it will be sufficient for President and Treasurer ^{and vice president} to execute, but in case above officers are interested, then a majority of Trustees may execute conveyances. The seal adopted is the common seal to be attached

8" The officers shall be a President, Clerk and Treasurer, vice president and Trustees not more than seven and not less than three
