WASHBURN - Washburn town meeting opened at noon Monday, March 15 at the Washburn Library with Mathew W. McManus as moderator. The polls were open until 7 p.m. when the meeting was adjourned to convene Tuesday evening at 7:30 p.m. in the Washburn High School Gymnasium.

Eugene Brown was elected to the school committee for three years and Otis Russell and Edmund J. Rollins to the town council for three year terms.

Brown defeated school committee member Clair Lavway by a vote of 103 to 85. Incumbent councilman Russell received 163 votes for one of two available council seats and Rollins was given 96 votes for the other seat. Ellsworth Woodman was defeated for the town council receiving 93 votes.

J. C. McCall, whose term expired, was not a candidate for re-election to the town council.
